

Lithium-ion batteries are a type of rechargeable battery typically used in power banks.

In accordance with the IATA Dangerous Goods Regulations (DGR), Lithium-ion batteries must follow specific shipping and packaging safety standards. One of the major risks associated with the transport of batteries and any battery-powered equipment is short-circuit of the battery, which may cause circuit damage, overheating, fire or explosion.

- Lithium-ion batteries may only be shipped at a state of charge (SoC) not exceeding 30% of their rated capacity.
- All lithium ion cells and batteries are forbidden for transport as cargo on passenger aircraft.
- Cells and batteries must not be packed in the same outer packaging with other dangerous goods.
